Beatrice Ashley Chanler's Lost Family Pedigree

This abstract is based primarily on a more in-depth paper titled *Myths to Live By* that had been compiled a few years ago by myself and later appended by William Chanler Jr., grandson of Beatrice Ashley Chanler. The research was in part a collaboration with my older brother George Thomas "Tommy" Collins, who lived under the same roof with his great grandfather George Thomas Collins I (1874-1962) who was Beatrice Ashley Chanler's half-brother.

The information for this current paper was culled from official records, city

archives, street maps, city directories, old photographs, and contemporaneous notes based on conversations with members of both the Collins and Chanler families. From this collection we were able to form a more concise picture of Beatrice Chanler's broken childhood and her siblings, who previously had been unknown.

Beatrice Ashley Chanler was the namesake created by the popular 19th century stage actress Minnie Ashley upon her marriage to the dashing and wealthy NY politician, William A. Chanler on December 4, 1903.

Prior to 1903 Beatrice had been married (1896) to a New York bit player, William Sheldon, but they had been living apart until they were formerly

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
divorced in 1902. While living with William Sheldon (born William Jones in Ohio, 1876), Beatrice used the Sheldon surname in public but kept Minnie Ashley as her stage name.

Beatrice Chanler's grandparents were Irish immigrants who arrived in America in 1845 during the height of the Irish Potato Famine. It is not clear if the couple had known each other prior to coming to America or if they met afterward. This said because their ports of entry were in different states; her grandfather, Michael Tully (1818-1857) disembarked in New York City, whereas her grandmother, Bridget Lyons (1824-1897?) arrived at the port of Boston in Massachusetts.

Bridget Lyons later moved to Fall River, MA, and in 1850 was listed as a single resident in the U.S. Census for that city. By contrast, the term "head of household" was a phrase used in city street directories and was designated for the husband, or main "bread winner" residing there. Street directories did not list the wife or children, unless the husband died and then the deceased's wife would be listed with the suffix "widow" with first and last name to follow. For this reason, Bridget Lyons was not listed in the Fall River Street Directory for the same year.

Michael Tully, on the other hand, had moved the same year he landed in New York to 21 Trinity Place (rear) in Manhattan. Later, he moved one apartment over to 20 Trinity Place, where he remained until his death. He worked as "porter."


As previously stated, only the male "head of household" was listed in city street directories, unless the male partner died and then his widow would be named. Yet in the space reserved for the deceased's "marital status" in the NYC Municipal Death record for Michael Tully, the word "unknown" appears. For this reason, one could not say with certainty




if Michael Tully and Bridget Lyons were "married" or if they had children when he died in 1857.

In the New York City Street Directory for the following year, 1858 there appeared a new listing for a residence at 145 11th Street with the name *Tully, Bridget, widow of Michael*. Widow Bridget Tully is listed as being employed as a "washer."

While circumstantial as it might appear, there was no listing for this Widow Bridget Tully for the years that follow in New York. There was also no birth record for a child born to this Tully/Lyons couple. But there was evidence that surfaced three years later that listed a marriage in Fall River, MA for a woman named Bridget Lyon Tully to one John Campbell.





Three additional documents prove this assertion:

1. The U.S. Census of 1880 for Fall River MA again shows a listing for John and Bridget Campbell along with three children; Sarah Jane Campbell (b.1861), Margaret Campbell (b.1864) and a *grandson* John Edward Collins. A grandson would indicate that one of the two adults had an older child that gave birth to boy that was born around 1873.

Since the "Collins" surname is different from the Campbell surname it would indicate that there had been a female daughter that had been married to male partner having Collins as his surname.

- 2. From an 1872 birth record in Fall River, MA there was a male child named John E. Collins that was born to a couple named George W. and Eliza F. Collins.
- 3. The 1870 Tiverton, RI marriage record for George and Eliza Collins shows that Eliza was the daughter of Bridget and Michael Tully (as evidenced by their names on the marriage document.) While there was never any proof of birth for Eliza Tully in Massachusetts, the age for Eliza Tully was listed on the marriage document

It should be acknowledged that for the years from 1851 to 1857 that there was no record of residence for Bridget Lyons or Bridget Tully, either in Fall River or NYC. It was in 1858, in New York when Widow Bridget Tully's name was first listed in the afore-mentioned NYC Street Directory. If the 1854 birth year for Eliza Tully were true this would indicate that Bridget Lyons had been living with Michael Tully, possibly in a "common law marriage", and that Eliza Tully was most likely born in New York but without proof of birth.

Note that the above listed marriage document does list Eliza Tully's birthplace as Massachusetts but in the 1880 census for Tiverton, RI (shown below), and elsewhere, her birthplace lists as "NY". This practice of name and date deception appears to be consistent throughout Eliza's life and has been discussed in depth in the afore-mentioned paper titled Myths to Live by.

There is little information about the young Eliza Tully except that she was around 6-years old when her mother Bridget remarried to John Campbell in 1861. That same year the newly-wed

Campbell couple had a daughter Sarah Jane, and in 1864 Bridget gave birth to another daughter, Margaret A Campbell. Of these two half-sisters to Eliza not much more is known.

More recently it was found in the 1870 US Census for Fall River Census that Eliza Tully's surname had been changed to Campbell, and on several occasions was used in conjunction with her Tully surname. In addition, Eliza's birthplace on this same document lists her birthplace as *New York* and her age listed as 17, which approximates her birth year elsewhere. Surprisingly, on this same 1870 census, there appeared the name of a 16-year old female by named Katie Campbell, who was 1-year younger than Eliza but born in Massachusetts. This new evidence might reveal that stepfather John Campbell had been married previously.

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At age 17 or 18, Eliza Tully (Campbell) met and married George William Collins of Tiverton, RI in 1872, the same year their son John Edward Collins was born. At the time of their first son's birth George W. and Eliza Collins were living at 91 South Main Street in Fall River, MA. George worked as a clerk nearby. South Main Street was walking distance from the house Eliza's parents lived. John Campbell owned a liquor shop nearby on John Street. The living situation seemed to have been planned so that John "Eddie" could easily have visitation with his grandparents.

In 1874, while Eliza Collins was 7 months pregnant with a second child, her husband George W. fell ill and died within a short time of cholera at the age of 22. He was buried at Oak Grove Cemetery in Fall River in same plot as his ancestors.

Two months after her husband's death, on July 16, 1874, Widow Eliza Collins gave birth to a second son, George Thomas Collins (1874-1962). Their son's birth was never recorded, although his draft registration of 1917 validates the birth date:

Widow Eliza Collins remained in the city of Fall River for the four years following her husband's death but moved two or three times to be closer to her parents who then lived on Columbia Street. The biological grandparents of both her sons were Captain George Thomas (1828-1888) and Mary (Baker) Collins (1830-1885) lived on Shove Street in Tiverton RI – a distance of less than three miles from where their two grandchildren had lived .

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The logistics of being a single parent and having to nurture and transport two young children between two households soon forced Widow Eliza Collins to consider placing each of her sons with a different set of grandparents. The final decision for making this move came one year prior to 1880 after Widow Eliza Collins had a brief affair with young man from the Fall River area whose surname was Whitehead. On May 7, 1880, Widow Eliza Collins gave birth to a daughter just over the Fall River border in Dartmouth, MA. On the birth record the daughter was named Minnie W. Collins with a notation stating that the birth was "illegitimate". The father's name was not provided for record:

This third birth for Widow Eliza Collins was the breaking point for her already complicated life. As it was apparent that taking care of her three children while living alone posed a heavy burden on their livelihood, it was a risk for her health as well. But moving her youngest son, George T. in with his Tiverton grandparents was not entirely based on the reasons previously discussed, but for a more clandestine reason. Not long after the birth of her daughter Minnie, Eliza Collins began dating Dartmouth butcher George W. Ashley (1845-1888) who was currently married to Azuba Collins, the cousin of her deceased husband George William Collins. See line 31 below:


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Proof of George T. Collins' placement with his grandparents in Tiverton can be found in the 1880 Census for the Tiverton, RI. Note on the last line item #50 (below) that the age of "George T.-Grandson" is six years, which sets his birth year to 1874. In addition, note at the end of the same line that "NY" was listed as the place of birth for (grandson) George T's mother.

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Some years passed from the time Widow Eliza Collins left her two boys with her parents and in-laws when she, George W. Ashley and daughter Minnie W. Collins were found to be living in Boston, MA. The Boston Street Directory of 1886 listed George W. Ashley, the butcher as head of household at living on 10 Castle Street (now Harvard Street) at the Hotel Helen.

In a news article published in the Boston Globe, on Sept 7, 1885 there happened to be a story about a 6-year old girl named Minnie Ashley who fell from a rooftop at 404 Tremont Street. Tremont Street runs parallel to Harvard Street in Boston – two streets east. The age of the girl in the news article was close to the year Eliza (Collins) Ashley's daughter was born.

John McDonald, 24 years old and living at 7 Florence street, while alighting from a horse-car at the corner of Washington and Worcester streets, was knocked down by a car coming from the opposite direction, and received a bad cut over the right eye, also several bruises. From 1886 until 1888 George W. Ashley was recorded in the Boston Street Directory at four hotel-apartments within the Boston proper. The last address was at 70 Harrison Avenue in the Chinatown district where George W. Ashley died on May 11, 1888.

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Two months after his death, George W. Ashley's wife Azuba H. Ashley was granted a decree for her divorce for adultery that was heard on December 30, 1887. Azuba was also granted the right to resume her maiden name of Azuba H. Collins.

The following year, the Boston Street Directory for 1889 obtained a new listing at 1 Lovering Place in South Boston for the Head of Household; Eliza F. widow of George W. Ashley.



Some ten years later, Widow Eliza Ashley would move back to New York with her talented and then famous daughter Minnie Ashley. After the marriage of Minnie to William A. Chanler, Eliza would move back to Manhattan where she would share an apartment with her son, John "Eddie" Collins (John used his middle name for much of his life). On September 5, 1939 Eliza Ashley died. Her remains

were shipped to Oak Grove Cemetery in Fall River, MA and buried in the same plot with her husband George William Collins.

One year after Eliza Ashley's death, her first son, John "Edward" Collins died in his apartment on 19th Street in New York City. In his Record of Death from New York City 1940, John Edward Collins' mother's name was reported as Eliza "Tully" and his father's name listed only as "George" (as in George William Collins). John never married and had no children.

Eliza's second son, George Thomas Collins (my great grandfather) died in 1992. He was married to Lucy Bell D'Arcy and had together two children, one grandchild and four great grandchildren. In the attached photograph, circa 1945, George T. Collins was depicted with his grandson, my father, George Anthony Collins Jr.

Addendum: There is scant mention of Bridget Lyons' parents, William and Catherine (Curly?) Lyons from notes left by my brother, George. And on the Fall River MA file card for Bridget and John Campbell's marriage, the name of William Lyons is was listed. Modern DNA testing may be hold hope for additional ancestry in Ireland.
